10.1 Direct services:

Overall objective: to provide therapeutic services to children that have experienced trauma or abuse.

Gauteng:

- to provide psychometric assessments to identified children within 2 schools
- to provide therapeutic services to child victims of trauma
- to provide support to the child and youth caregivers at the SOS Children's Village in Mamelodi, Pretoria

Western Cape:

- to provide therapeutic services to child victims of trauma within the Table View area
- To provide individual and group therapy for children at Tenderton Place of Safety in Wynberg.

10.2 Training and mentoring

Overall objective: to provide training and professional growth opportunities to interns and professionals working within the field of trauma, child protection and scholastic assessments.

Gauteng:

- To provide internships to 2 students
- To sponsor 4 social workers from child protection NPO's to attend training

Western Cape:

- To provide internships to 2 students
- To sponsor 4 social workers from child protection NPO's to attend training

C. OBJECTIVES FOR 2012/2013

1. Development of Monitoring and evaluation system
2. Developing a model for psycho-social services for children's home
3. Direct services in Western Cape

Jelly Beanz Inc would like to provide therapeutic services to children and families (individual, group and family) from the Ysterplaat community through to Melkbosstrand.

Services are also to be offered to children who sexually abuse other children (ages 0-14) as a prevention strategy. These services will include assessments and where appropriate inclusion of such children into a group therapy programme

4. Resource development

Following are the resources that we will be focusing on in 2012-13:

- The translation of **Voices of Hope** into 3 further African languages (Zulu, Sotho and Afrikaans) and the distribution thereof on a national level.
- Develop an **activity book for children** (5-9 years) that can be facilitated by parents and caregivers which provides basic age appropriate sex education and child abuse prevention information.
- The finalization of a **'Bust Bullying'** programme that is to be implemented in schools which provides a platform for debate and empowerment regarding this topic.
- The manufacturing of **anatomically correct dolls** by a group of refugee women who have been trained and supervised by Jelly Beanz Inc is to be continued. Thus far no funding has been sought for this project, however to make it sustainable to provide this much needed tools to children that have been sexually abused, funding will be sought for this project for 2012 onwards.
