3078 hours of
counselling to
342 children and their
families.

Some of the things we did during COVID-19:

- This was probably one of the busiest times since Jelly Beanz began. All staff returned to the office as soon as lockdown level 4 was announced.
- We became creative and skilled at providing online counselling and support. As soon as possible we continued with face-to-face counselling services.
- Jelly Beanz developed a radio broadcast (in 12 different languages) with an audience of about 24 million, interviewed for a Podcast for UNICEF and presented a webinar together with ISPCAN (attended by 290 people) regarding the implications of lockdown on our children in Africa.
- Together with CINDI & Dlananathi we developed a booklet for communities regarding COVID, child protection and mental health.
- In collaboration with the NACCW and Children's Institute we developed a 12-hour accredited training programme for Child Care Workers.
- We received and distributed donations of over 400 food parcels, clothing, and 400 handmade Jelly Beanz masks.
- We wrote therapeutic stories for children regarding their fears and realities during COVID-19.



Jelly Beanz hosted the African Child Trauma Conference on 7 & 8 October, our first virtual event. It was a great success with over 300 people attending. We had international, African and South African keynotes who provided powerful messages of advocacy for change for children for their care and protection. Panel discussions and presentations on a range of topics included protecting children from sexual exploitation online, food security, the important role of fathers, safe parks and many more.
